A. Head of Charter Organization:

C. Troop Secretary:

- 52 scouts. (10 sets of siblings)

- Still waiting to collect dues from 9 scouts
- 5 patrols were created, some over 10 now. Don't have enough patrol leaders or equipment.
 - o Should we stop accepting scouts?
 - Let's monitor
 - o Troop is skewed very young, so leadership is sparse.

D. Scoutmaster:

- Ziplining trip in Catamount
 - New campsite about 45 min away from catamount, about the same distance as the previously used site. Beautiful, 3 sites at the back – had running water, electricity and bathrooms. Use this campsite when going back to catamount.
 - o Ziplining was a hit.
 - o 12 drivers on Friday night, didn't have 12 leaving, so had to squeeze people and gear in.
 - o Cars were at the site, so scouts were prone to making piles and shoving stuff into cars. Need to build better habits around packing.
 - o Need to revisit menu planning.

 - o Built mini library at home, then installed at park.
 - o Fundraising occurred this past weekend. Still looking for donations collecting electronics.
- Matt Rapa Spin Cycle Fundraiser for Eagle Project
 - o Fundraiser was successful,
 - o He is completing final required badges and will submit final binder to council before end of October.

 - o Well attended: 30 scouts (biggest group at the event)

E. Troop Treasurer:

• Ending balance: \$3923

- Collected for catamount
 - o Pd drivers, pd catamount
 - o Need to pay for food and other expenses.
- Expense:
 - o Wreaths 50% deposit to Hicks
 - o Reconciled high adventure (from pancake breakfast money)
 - 17 total scouts for both high adventures
 - Summit 2024 was over collected so refunded

- Wreaths
 - \circ Ordered 852 wreaths will increase to 948 wreaths due to extra 5 scouts (additional 72 wreaths).
 - Pinecones some were in bad shape, so need to ask for replacement
 - Choosing "business" delivery saved \$100.
 - Hicks was pd 50% deposit.
 - \$11.25 per wreath this year, ~15% more than last year.
 - Selling for \$20 each
 - American Legion approved pickup location
 - St. Aiden's approved Dec 1 sale of wreaths
 - Flyers were distributed at last meeting.
 - o Total expenditure: \$19000
 - Expected profit: \$5800
